**Jeff Allam**

A leading touring car star from the '70s through to the 1990s, special guest Jeff Allam raced some of the most iconic cars in BTCC history, before finishing his career at the wheel of a Super Touring Vauxhall Cavalier.



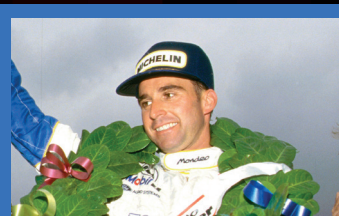
**Charlie Cox**

The voice of the later Super Touring years on British television, Australia's Charlie Cox was a competitor before that and he intends to join the celebrations at Brands Hatch this Sunday.



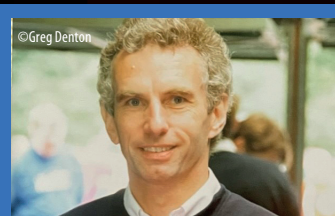
**Greg Murphy**

**Andy Rouse**

A four-time champion of the BTCC, Andy Rouse is one of Britain's most successful saloon car racers of all time and he'll be attending as a special guest this weekend.



**Steve Soper**

One of the most iconic BTCC racers of all time, Steve Soper returns to Brands Hatch this weekend to join the demos at the wheel of a Ford Sierra Cosworth RS500 he raced in period.



**Ash Sutton**

Three-time BTCC champion and contemporary series leader Ash Sutton will join in with the celebrations of touring car heritage by representing the modern era at the wheel of a NAPA Racing UK Ford Focus ST on Sunday



**Jake Hill**

A current BTCC frontrunner with a love for historic racing, Jake Hill will be out this weekend as part of a team of three drivers alongside Anthony Reid and Richard Wheeler in a Nissan Primera super team.



**Dan Cammish**

A star of the modern BTCC, Dan Cammish spearheads NAPA Racing UK's modern day BTCC efforts alongside Ash Sutton. Cammish will be attending Super Touring Power as a guest on Saturday.



**Steven Richards**

Another V8 Supercars ace with Bathurst wins to their name is Steven Richards, who is piloting a Volvo S40 which his father raced in period at Brands Hatch this weekend.



**Ian Flux**
