Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q 12.21.4 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

### **Brief Details:**

Viewed CCTV and live stream potentially involving four cars 17, 22, 53 and 81, which proved inconclusive. Viewing in car from 81 which showed him approaching a backmarker, 22, at McLeans. He attempted to pass to the left but ran out of road and onto kerb. He visibly backed off and moved to the right to overtake. He continued to move right when car 53 was passing him to the extent he was nearly fully past. Car 53 holds the line and car 81 makes contact with them. Car 53 spins across the front of 81 and into 22. "" retired in gravel and 53 retired to pit lane at end of lap. Car 81 completed the race. On the balance of probabilities I find car 81 wholly responsible for the collision.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Disqualified from the results of the race  
Number of Licence Penalty Points: 4

You are reminded of your right of appeal. Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C 2.1.4
