Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q 12.21.4 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

### **Brief Details:**

Contact between Cars 28 + 66 at Turn 3.

Car 66 attempted to overtake Car 28 on the inside of the corner, to lap him; at the braking point, Car 66 was two car lengths behind Car 28, and attempted an overtake, causing front to rear contact on the inside apex, causing Car 28 to spin.

Car 28 then rejoined, Car 66 retired.

Driver of Car 66 stated that Car 28 was lapped on the previous corner by another competitor, so assumed that Car 28 was aware that Car 66 was behind him, causing the overtake attempt.

CCTV footage + On-Board footage of Car 66 reviewed, driver of Car 66 interviewed + reminded of his right to appeal.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:
