Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q 12.21.4 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

Car 89 (Brendan Herd) & Car 58 (Tom Muirhead) were exiting Graham Hill bend (Turn 3) side by side approaching Surtees (Turn 4) when car 89 turned towards the apex of Surtees (Turn 4) across the front of car 58 resulting in the L/H Rear wheel of Car 89 making contact with the R/H front wheel of Car 58, resulting in Car 89 spinning and continuing while Car 58 continued but with both cars retiring to the pit lane with damage. Both drivers interviewed and Driver of Car 89 admitted that he thought he was far enough ahead to take the line but didn't appreciate the actual position of Car 58 at the time. Driver of Car 89 (Brendan Herd) warned to be more aware in future in such circumstances. Decision provided verbally at 15:15 hrs to both drivers and Right of Appeal advised.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Verbal Warning

You are reminded of your right of appeal. Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C 2.1.4
