Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q. 12.12 Formation Lap Procedure

Brief Details:

After the Green Flag lap, Car 2 on pole position stalled and stopped at the race start. The start was aborted a delayed start board was shown from the gantry followed by a Green Flag was shown for a further formation lap after the showing of a 1 minute board, then a 30 second board and a Green Flag. Car 2 on pole position left the grid. At the exit of Copse Corner, Car 2 was passed first by Car 38 (Finn Harrison) and then by Car 9 (Megan Bruce) and car 50 (Jack Taylor). All other cars remained in their correct positions. On returning to the grid the 5 second board was shown followed by the start lights. It was ascertained that all cars were in their correct positions when the start was given.

All three drivers and their Team Managers/Guardians were present when the matter was heard by the Clerk of the Course, the Deputy Clerk and the Driving Standards Advisor.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Additional Comments: This situation would possible have been averted had their been an electronic info board adjacent to the start lights.

You are reminded of your right of appeal. Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C 2.1.4
