Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q 12.21.4 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

### **Brief Details:**

From the start of the race, car 22 had a better start than car 2. Car 22 moved to the right of 2 between the car and the pit wall. there initially appeared to be a car width and as car 22 got further alongside there was contact between the two cars which caused a race stop. On viewing the in car footage i could see that although limited there was sufficient space for car 22. The driver of car 2 said that car 22 should have pulled out of the move and thus avoid the accident. I disagreed and found that he was entitled to go for the move and car 2 initially appeared to leave the space. I find car 2 predominately responsible for the incident.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Disqualified from the results of the race  
Number of Licence Penalty Points: 4

Additional Comments: Championship penalty under 6.10 and 21.9.1 refer

You are reminded of your right of appeal. Any penalties applied will be recorded by Motorsport UK in accordance with Motorsport UK Regulation C 2.1.4
