Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

C 1.1.5 Driving in a manner not compatible with general safety

Brief Details:

There was an incident on lap 1 of the Woodcote Trophy / Stirling Moss Trophy at the exit of the Old Hairpin and approaching Starkeys. The incident involved Car 123 (Mark Cole), Car 27 (Richard Postins) and Car 41 (Mark Donner). Evidence was heard from all three drivers. It is evident that Car 41 was, in effect, an incident bystander in the incident. Cole stated that at the Old Hairpin he was overtaken 'aggressively' by Postins. Cole then admitted making contact with Postins 'several times.' saying that if you (Postins) were going to be aggressive with me, then I would be aggressive back. The effect of this contact was to push Postins car into that of Mark Donner immediately to his right. Circuit CCTV was viewed along with the onboard from Car 27. There was no video available from Car 123. The Clerk of the Course did not consider the overtaking manoeuvre at the Old Hairpin to be aggressive. Before delivering the decision, the Clerk of the Course showed CCTV footage of the overtaking manoeuvre of Car 27 overtaking Car 123. The matter is referred to the Stewards for further consideration.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:
