Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q 12.21.4 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

Car 77 (James Barwell) made contact with Car 73 Ashley Law in Sports 2000 Race 2 (R8 on timetable) causing damage to both cars and retirement from the race. Car 77 was behind car 73 on the exit to Coram T11 and went to the left of Car 73 on the approach to Murray's T12 and tried to brake before the apex to Murrays T12 but locked up and went over the grass at speed and made contact with L/H front of Car 73 causing it to spin. Car 77 carried straight on over the track and onto the grass outfield and made frontal contact with tyre wall. Video evidence from circuit cameras and both cars viewed and drivers provided verbal evidence. Decision given verbally to both drivers at 12:39 hours and Right of appeal
