Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK Regulation(s):

Q 12.21.4 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

Following a safety car period during Sports 2000 Duratec qualifying session having just resumed Green Flag conditions Car 6 Peter Brouwer moved across towards at the entrance to Copse corner to take his racing line and made side to side contact with Car 71, Paul Trayhurn which caused car 71 to spin into the gravel and was unable to continue. Video from Car 71 viewed and both drivers interviewed. Circuit CCTV also observed.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK Regulation G 5.3, I hereby order that you receive the following:

Additional Comments: Driver of Car 6 - Peter Brouwer admitted that he was unaware of the proximity of Car 71.
