Season so far:

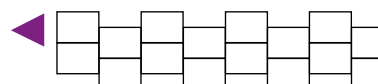

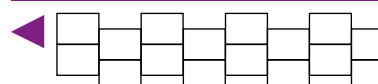
GRID POSITIONS – RACE 1

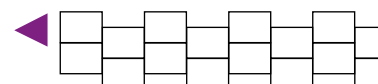

DESCRIPTION

Focus Cup is bringing the Arrive and Drive concept to racing. With no need to build, transport or maintain your own race car. Simply arrive at the track with your race kit and race licence and enjoy a weekend of practice and racing!

SPECIFICATION

The Ford Focus 2.0TDCi Zetec S 3 door is the chosen vehicle for the Focus Cup. The torquey diesel engine packs enough punch to provide close, fun racing and being more economical to run keeps the budget reasonable. The Zetec S version has the rear diffuser, rear spoiler and side skirts as fitted to the ST model and looks fantastic with the twin 4" tail pipes and front wide body kit from ABS composite panels. Fitted with a K&N filter, custom Direnza exhaust and with help from Track'n'Road in Essex and CC Tuning in Burton performance has been enhanced to 175HP and 310 lb/ft. The car's handling has been taken care of with a set of specially designed dampers from AST Suspension in Holland, Powerflex adjustable rear bushes for more rear camber and wider offset wheels with Nankang Tyres. All this finished off with a Safety devices rollcage, HEL braided hoses, Lifeline extinguisher system and of course - Mintex brake pads.

POINTS AND REWARDS

During qualifying competitors will be awarded points per their classified times. Starting with fastest time earning 30 points, second fastest 26 points, third fastest 23 and fourth fastest earning 21 points. In descending order down the grid each driver then earns a point less so fifth will be 20 points and sixth 19 points and so on. Qualifying really is a chance to gain ground on your competitors around you. Race points work exactly the same as qualifying bar fastest lap earns the driver a bonus five points.

Sprinting is a high-speed discipline in which drivers take turns to set a time around a lap of a race circuit or a set course, with the fastest times determining the results. Cars start singly and are timed by electronic equipment accurate to 100th of a second. Sprints are typically held on racing circuits and disused airfields, with venues spread right across the country.

Competitors are given one or two practice runs before the competition proper starts. Usually, you will get two or three runs against the clock, with your best time counting in the final results. A major positive with sprinting is that if you get your first run wrong you still have a chance of making amends on later runs.

Road going cars are eligible to participate, and the vast majority of competitors will not need to fit a roll cage, fire extinguisher or harness to take part. Events take place over just a single day, avoiding the need to book accommodation.

The Lotus Cup UK Speed Championship operates similar technical rules to the FIA approved Lotus Cup Europe race series. There will be three separate championships in 2022, one for normally-aspirated Production cars, one for forced induction Production cars and one for faster SuperSport cars. Drivers can easily graduate to racing if they want once, they are comfortable with their performance and ready to take the next step.

Lotus Cup UK Speed Championship is designed to be fun and sociable, creating an environment where Lotus owners can meet up whilst taking part in grass roots motor sport.

DESCRIPTION

Each of the 2022 championship's rounds has been selected for their suitability for all levels of experience and types of car, with a variety of venues around the UK. These will include Donington Park, Goodwood, Snetterton, Lydden Hill and Cadwell Park race circuits where drivers will sometimes compete on the same bill as wheel to wheel race championships. There will also be a visit to the Lotus test track at Hethel as well as a return to the classic sprint circuits of Curborough & Debden.

COSTS

Basic start price - £10,000 (Elise) to £60,000 (Exige V6)
Running costs - From £100 per round

POINTS

1st-20, 2nd-18, 3rd-16, 4th-15, then incrementally down one point for each finishing position score. Bonus points for number of cars beaten in class. 1 bonus point for fastest 1st run in class. Six highest scoring rounds count towards the Championship.

Toyo Tires Racing Saloons

Sharing a grid this weekend with the Z Cars Championship, there's bound to be plenty of action throughout the field.

TTRS caters for a wide variety of 2WD saloons, coupe's & hatchbacks in a multi-class structure. At the front of the field are E36 M3's, Sierra Cosworths, Jaguars and newer machinery such as Ford Fiesta ST180's. Whilst the leading RWD machines are favourite to dominate in the dry, there are often outright wins for lighter FWD machinery in slippery conditions.

Stu Waite in his E36 M3 is hot favourite for the outright win, but Peter Kaylor continues to gain speed in his M1 Seat SuperCopa and could have the agility to perform well.

Toyo Tires Z Cars Championship

Gaining Championship status for 2021 and now with its first Champion, Edd Giddings; the Z Cars Championship opened 2022 with a 45 minute race at Silverstone GP circuit in March.

The popular BMW Z4 (E85 Pre-Facelift) 3.0 M54 engined car

makes for a fast, fun and affordable step up in circuit racing. With a Hybrid Tune ECU chip, these cars produce 245bhp, weigh 1350kg's and handle like go-karts.

Many Z4 drivers have graduated from quad bike racing, so are used to close racing and their previous racing camaraderie is evident in the fun and friendly paddock atmosphere.

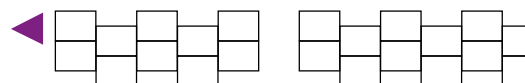
Chris Murphy took the win in the first round of 2022, with 2021 Champion, Edd Giddings, retiring with overheating issues in his newly built car. Callum Bates finished 2nd with Matt Dance and impressive 3rd.

Round 2 & 3 at Donington Park saw the woes continue for Giddings with engine failure continuing his 2022 record of zero points. Meanwhile, a maiden win for Matt Dance and a win for Callum Bates resulted in those two drivers along with Chris Murphy being tied for the top spot after 3 rounds.

With Murphy unable to attend Cadwell, and Bates currently not on the entry list; Dance has the opportunity to, well, dance off with the trophies and Championship lead.

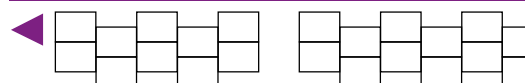

Three-time National champion Aaron Smith heads the points standings after four rounds, and comes to Cadwell with a win and three runner-up slots already chalked up in the 1.3-litre performance-packed class.

However, a brace of victories from twice champion Rupert Deeth reveals a mere 3-point margin, so with 20 for a win plus 1 point for fastest lap there is still loads to play for in the 16-round calendar.

In third overall, former BTCC race winner Jeff Smith has moved up in formulae after three back-to-back National Se7en titles and has so far been on the pace with a brace of podium finishes, while another former BTCC star, and the 2021 Miglia champion, Andrew Jordan scored a win in the opening Silverstone meet in March, although with Historic and Rallycross commitments as well his entry here had yet to be confirmed.

Of the rest pencilled in, 2015 champion Kane Astin can be expected to challenge the leaders, as might Ashley Davies, Ben Colburn and Lewis Selby.

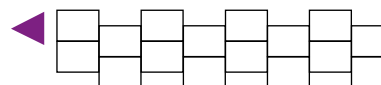
Mini Libre

A double-maximum score at Snetterton last month gives Richard Colburn a clear lead in the eclectic A-Series category, his 5-porter so far proving reliable over some of the larger capacity variations.

Of these, Phil Harvey usually runs a 1380cc capacity 5-porter, indeed having won the class title on in 2018/19 seasons, while Peter Hills' 16-valve can be quick but reliability is less certain, likewise Craig Cox' 8-port example despite a Silverstone victory.

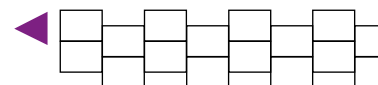

After four exciting races at Donington Park and Silverstone, the AMC Vehicle Solutions United Formula Ford in association with LMC Technologies Championship is finely poised as MSVR's Formula Ford cars arrive here at Cadwell Park for the latest rounds of the 2022 season.

Race victories in the opening four events by James Hadfield, Matt Rivett and Colin Queen (twice), means that the top runners in the overall drivers' standings are separated by just two points. Courtesy of two maximum scores at Silverstone, that included victory in the prestigious Jim Walsh Trophy, it is 18-year-old American racer, Queen, who leads the title race for the Ammonite Motorsport squad.

Matt Rivett, winner of the second race of 2022 at Donington, will certainly be a man to watch here in Lincolnshire though, the rapid Van Diemen RF91 racer, leader of the Heritage (Pre '93) section of the championship, will drive with his car overseen by Enigma Motorsport. Rivett, a multiple FF1600 race winner, will be keen to stamp his authority on the Heritage class here at Cadwell and add as many points as possible to his total for his championship quest.

After somewhat of a disappointing start to the season, Adam Fathers is hoping for an upturn in luck on this his first visit to Cadwell Park. Driving a Fathers Finishers-supported Ray, Fathers has been on the end of bad luck at Donington and Silverstone, when engine problems prevented him from challenging for a strong result. A fresh engine installed for this weekend should see Fathers back in contention.

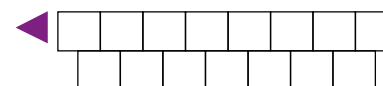
Jack Kemp is also set to line-up in a Ray chassis. The self-entered racer has been a strong supporter of MSVR and James Beckett Motorsport FF1600 races during the last few years, and has been seen this season at both Donington Park and Silverstone, as has Ben Cox who will also drive a Ray, this time for the Souley Motorsport team. The Oxfordshire-based youngster made his FF1600 debut in the final Aumento Coaching Champion of Brands race last season, and has shown a good turn of pace this year so far.

Formula Ford 1600 legend, Bernard Dolan, brings his team to Cadwell Park this weekend - and it is well represented. Three cars will line-up for his Norfolk-based stable. Morgan Quinn makes the trip to Lincolnshire from Ireland to compete, while Gabe Tesch represents the United States and Norfolk-based Scot, Ben Cochran, is no stranger to MSVR FF1600 success having won at Snetterton last October - his first category victory. All three are making their first United Formula Ford starts of the 2022 season, and are most welcome.

James Clarke is another driver making a United Formula Ford debut, although the youngster is well-known in racing circles from previous competition in Clubmans Sports and FF1600. Clarke will drive a self-entered Van Diemen RF90, and should go well in a class that will see him go well. Another driver to welcome back on-track is Mike Gardner. Winner of many FF1600 races, including MSVR Heritage FF1600 events here at Cadwell, Gardner has been absent from racing for a while but has chosen this event to make his return. The Newark-based racer will drive a Crossle 30/32F and will contest the Classic (Pre '82) class.

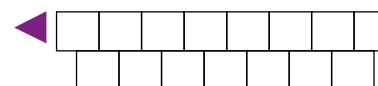

Trackday Trophy returns to Cadwell Park in 2022, following a two year hiatus from the stunning, Lincolnshire Wolds circuit.

The track differs greatly from what TDT competitors experienced first time out at Silverstone, as Cadwell boasts an array of tight, twisting bends that combine with a number of steep and sudden elevation changes. MSVR All-Comers kicks off its 2022 campaign at the Mini-Nürburgring, Cadwell Park, where we welcome you all to the first races of the 2022 MSVR All-Comers Series. This year promises to be action packed with varied grids at some excellent circuits!

The MSVR All-Comers is the most diverse series in the UK and has served as a reliable place for licence signatures and interesting racing from different-specification machinery.

This weekend marks a fresh start for the series with new Coordinator Will Marston taking ownership of the series with fresh ideas, looking to increase interest and grid sizes.

A new competitor is John Jackson in his No.57 2011 Aston Martin Vantage GT4, who is undergoing a "baptism of fire" this weekend by being new to both the car and circuit racing, with prior experience in stage rallies. The car itself has raced in another MSVR-run championship, GT Cup and it's fantastic to see it being raced by its new custodians in Class 1.

Long-time competitor Nick Starkey returns in his trusty Caterham C400 (No.2), looking to make a strong start to his season's trophy collection by competing in Class 2.

Cadwell Park is a uniquely challenging circuit, renowned/ regarded as the 'Mini-Nürburgring' due to the proximity of the barriers and lack of gravel run-off areas. This will test all of our drivers and allow their individual strengths to come to light through the wide array of corners from the slow Hairpin and tight Mountain to the faster Coppice and Chris Curve. The power of the cars will come into play down Park Straight as it features an uphill gradient leading into Park, and acceleration grip will be tested coming out of Barn for the sprint to Coppice.

The racing is split into two classes with factory-built racing and open cockpit cars filling Class 1, and Class 2 made up by race-prepared production-based cars. These allow for fierce competition throughout the grid and makes for well-earned trophies come the chequered flag.

Spectator viewing of the circuit is extensive with numerous grandstands and pathways across the majority of the circuit. Action hotspots include the Mountain Grandstand for a dynamic view of the cars as they change direction, and pedestrian fencing by the Hall Bends for a close-up view of curbing-riding

FLAGS

BLUE (STEADY)

Another competitor is close.

BLUE (WAVED)

Another competitor is trying to pass.

WHITE

Service vehicle or very slow car on circuit.

YELLOW (WAVED)

Danger, slow down sufficiently to ensure that full control of the vehicle can be retained. No overtaking.

YELLOW (DOUBLE WAVED)

Great danger. Slow down considerably. Be prepared to suddenly change from the projected racing line, or take other evasive action including stopping if necessary. No overtaking. (This signal may be supplemented or replaced by flashing yellow light(s), as an added warning).

YELLOW/RED STRIPES

Slippery surface ahead.

GREEN (WAVED)

All clear, at the end of a danger area controlled by yellow flags. Also used to signal the start of a formation lap and shown at all posts during first lap of each practice session and during the formation lap.

RED

STOP RACING, proceed slowly to pits or startline as instructed by marshals (at startline & individual marshal's posts). Race stopped.

BLACK/ORANGE DISK

Warning of mechanical failure which might not be obvious to driver; call into pits immediately.

BLACK/WHITE DIAGONAL

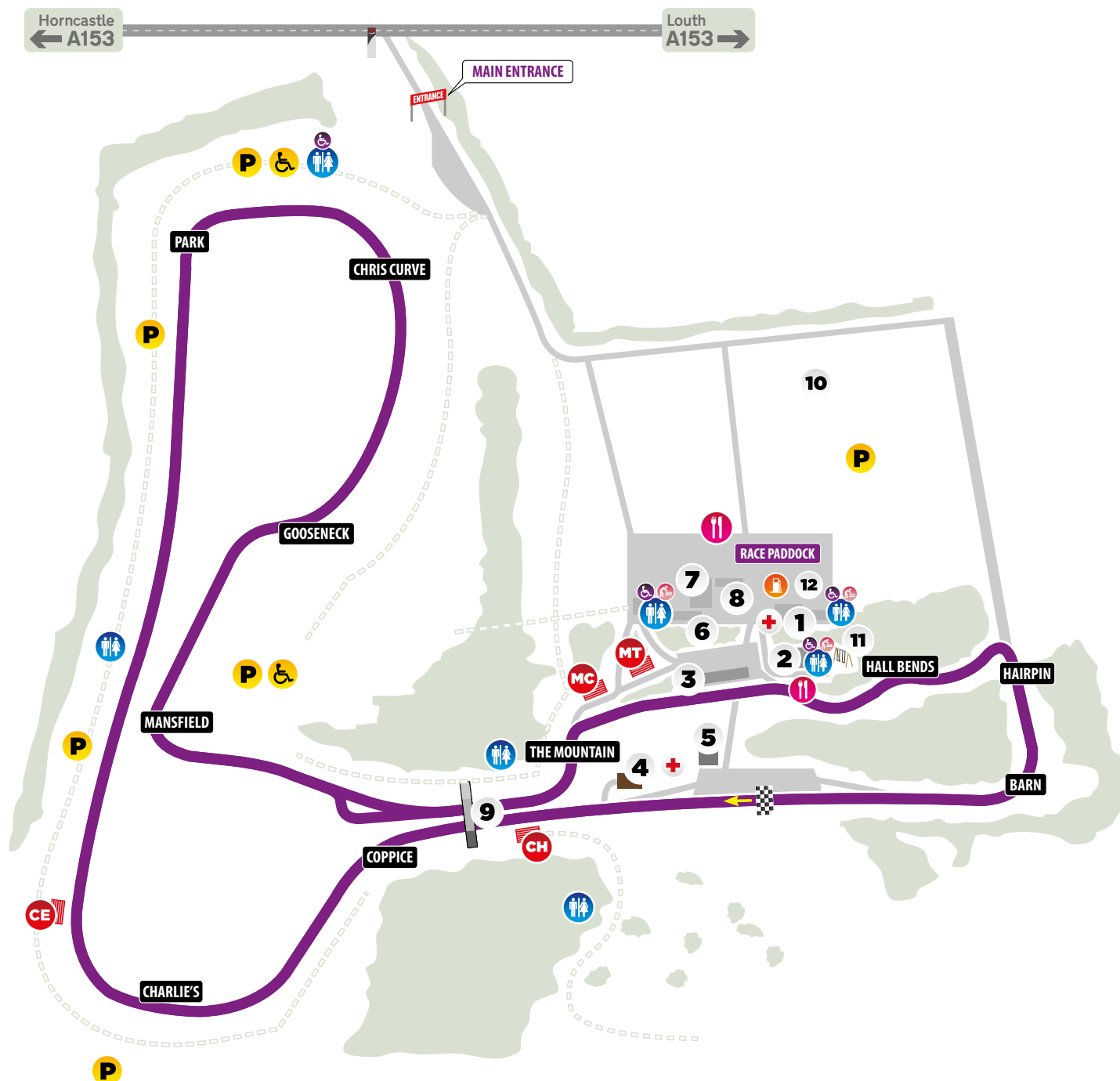
Warning to driver that his/her behaviour (e.g. corner cutting) is suspect and he/her may be black flagged.

BLACK

Driver must call in immediately and report to the Clerk of the Course.

BLACK & WHITE CHEQUERED

End of the race.
